

Recommendations

- It is recommended that the cut-off points be modified by assigning a total point of 7 to moderate risk level and a total point score of 13 be assign a high risk level.
- The term "High" risk should be replaced with the term "Higher Risk" since the vast majority of these released prisoners do not return to prison within three years.
- Thus, parole is a proper decision for "Higher" risk cases but with the requirement of specialized supervision and/or re-entry services.
- It should not negatively impact the current parole grant rate of about 65% which is appropriate given the current recidivism rate of 26%.
