

MANDATORY PAROLE RELEASE GUIDELINE WORKSHEET

NRS 213.1215 requires the Board to release eligible inmates under Mandatory Parole Release (MPR) unless the Board determines that the prisoner would be a danger to public safety while on parole. The risk level adopted by the Board for the discretionary release of prisoners will be considered when considering the release of a prisoner under MPR.

Prisoners who have been convicted of an offense listed in NRS 213.1214 (certain sex offenders) may not be released on MPR unless they are certified as not being a high risk to re-offend using a standard method of assessment.

After reviewing the record of the above referenced inmate, the Board finds that there is a reasonable probability that the prisoner would be a danger to public safety if released on parole. This determination is based on the following reasons (indicate the specific information relative to the selected reasons. The specific information provided will be included in the denial statement):

- The parole guidelines indicate the prisoner is a high risk to re-offend.
- The prisoner was evaluated in accordance with NRS 213.1214 and was determined to be a high risk, or higher than moderate risk to re-offend.
- The prisoner has made statements indicating he/she will refuse to comply with the terms and conditions of parole.
- The prisoner has made threats against another person and release to the community could jeopardize public safety.
- The prisoner has a history of convictions for violent crimes.
- The prisoner has engaged in violent behavior while incarcerated.
- The prisoner has been convicted of multiple felony offenses of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance.
- The prisoner has previously committed crimes while on community supervision.
- The criminal conduct of the prisoner has increased in severity over time.
- The prisoner has demonstrated an attitude or behavior which indicates that the prisoner favors a criminal lifestyle (i.e., gang activities, planning escapes or other criminal activity, etc.).

- The prisoner has not satisfied the minimum requirements for mandatory release in accordance with subsection 2 of NRS 213.1215 and the Board has determined that discretionary release at the time would not be appropriate.
