You shall follow the rules of the Division of Parole and Probation to include the following: <u>Residence:</u> You shall not change your place of residence without first obtaining permission from the Division of Parole and Probation, in each instance.

<u>Reporting</u>: You shall report as instructed to the Division of Parole and Probation and follow the instructions of the Division about how and when you must submit supplied reports to the Division. This report shall be true and correct in all respects.

Employment/Program: You shall seek and maintain legal employment, or maintain a program approved by the Division of Parole and Probation and not change such employment or program without first obtaining permission. All terminations of employment or program shall be immediately reported to the Division.

Restitution: You shall pay any court ordered restitution by making payments until the balance is paid in full. The minimum monthly payment shall be established by dividing the balance owed at the time of release on parole by the number of projected months to be served on parole. If, after dividing the total restitution owed by the number of projected months to be served on parole the monthly payment is equal to an amount less than \$50, the monthly payment shall be \$50 until the balance is paid in full.

Fines/Fees: You shall pay all applicable fines and fees on a schedule determined by the Division of Parole and Probation.

<u>Out-of-State Travel</u>: You shall not leave the state without first obtaining written permission from the Division of Parole and Probation, in each instance.

Associates: You shall not associate with convicted felons, any person on probation or parole supervision, or other persons with whom your supervising officer instructs you not to associate, unless specific written permission has been granted by the Division of Parole and Probation. You shall not have any contact with persons confined in a correctional institution unless specific written permission has been granted by the Division and the correctional institution.

<u>**Graduated Sanctions:**</u> You shall comply with all graduated sanctions imposed by the Division. Failure to comply with a sanction may constitute a technical violation of the conditions of parole.

<u>Controlled Substances</u>: You shall not use, purchase or possess any illegal drugs, or any prescription drugs, unless first prescribed by a licensed medical professional. You shall immediately notify the Division of Parole and Probation of any prescription received. You shall refrain from the use and possession of any synthetic/designer drug or any mind and/or body altering substance. You shall submit to drug testing as required by the Division or its agent.

<u>Recreational Marijuana</u>: You shall not purchase, consume or have under your control marijuana in any form, except when such use is prescribed for use as a medicine in accordance with the provisions of chapter 453A of NRS.

<u>Intoxicants</u>: You shall not purchase, consume or have under your control any alcohol beverage, unless specifically permitted by special condition of the Board. Upon the direction of the Division of Parole and Probation or other peace officer, you shall submit to a medically recognized test for blood/breath content.

<u>Weapons</u>: You shall not possess, have access to, or have under your control, any type of weapon unless the item is used in conjunction with the duties of legitimate employment and has been approved in writing by the Division of Parole and Probation or its agent.

Laws: You shall comply with all institutional rules, municipal, county, state, and federal laws and ordinances. If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the Division of Parole and Probation within 72 hours.

No Victim Contact: You may not contact or communicate with the victim or any person directly and proximately harmed by the commission of a criminal offense under any law of this State, or solicit another person to contact or communicate on your behalf with the victim or any person directly and proximately harmed by the commission of a criminal offense under any law of this State unless approved in writing by the Division of Parole and Probation.

Warrants: You shall satisfy any outstanding warrants within 90 days of your release from custody.
